## *Manager/Fire Chief's Report*

Good day everyone.

I would like to give you a quick brief on what the fire department has been up to since our last report to you.

Since the last briefing report, we have responded to 12 Medical Calls, 3 Fire responses, 4 Monitored Alarms, 2 Motor Vehicle Collisions, and one home entrapment rescue. To date we have attended 85 incident calls.

The fire department continues to work on its altered medical responses to protect our volunteers and staying in line with Alberta Health Services recommendations for response, with EMS personnel, and other health care workers.

Our weekly training is continuing on its regular schedule. We continue to practice our responsibilities for safe physical distancing and group limits as determined by the Alberta Government at this time. In addition, 6 of our current members have participated in and passed both the practical skills and written exams to become Pumper Operations Qualified. This was a 40-hour course, and I am thrilled to have these members on our team.

The ICS (Incident Command System) level 100 has been delivered to the members who have not taken the course yet, with plans to deliver the ICS 200 course this winter.

In Summary, the fire department continues to train and perfect their skills for the betterment of the Communities we serve, and the dedication of these members to serve their communities is second to none.
