



Chief Administrative Officer Report February 8, 2022

February 3 – Electric Vehicle Charging Program Information Session; Snow clearing legalities and municipal policy-making; Keep the RCMP Information Session

The next G5 meeting is to be hosted by Rycroft in the spring. A date can be determined once some meeting topics are generated.

After almost 10 days of pumping from the Spirit River, we have stopped pumping on February 3 due to lack of flow in the river. A total of 236 hrs since we started pumping on January 24. We are poised to pump more if flow increases enough during the next forecasted warm spell.

New agreements were signed with the Realtor to list all of our available properties for sale until February 28, 2023.

From the Central Waste Management Commission research, it was noted by the engineers that to open a new landfill in Saddle Hills County would take approximately 3 years. The Clairmont landfill noted that they have a 100 year horizon to accommodate solid waste from our area.

No objections were received from referral agencies or adjacent landowners for Subdivision Permit # 2021-01, SW-78-5-W6; Plan 8922532, Lot 21 (UFA). As the proposed subdivision does not conflict with Provincial regulations, meets statutory requirements of the Municipal Development Plan, and complies with the Highway Development District of the Land Use Bylaw; and is deemed compatible with existing and future land uses in the surrounding area, it was approved with basic conditions.

We applied for a \$5,000 Healthy Communities Grant for the East Side Dog Park Project that is budgeted at \$12,000.

We advertised a Request for Proposal to replace the Water Treatment Plant roof, closing March 4.

We advertised a Request for Proposal to re-line 500 meters of our Sanitary Sewer line, closing March 18.
