- Subscription to AAMA Newsletter which includes articles of interest from fellow airport operators, Alberta newspapers, proceedings of Alberta municipal council meetings and Canada wide topics related to airports. The newsletter includes schedules of upcoming seminars, training, and conferences in Alberta and across Canada.

- The AAMA Board of Directors is composed of 8 directors who are current or retired airport managers in Alberta, some of which have 20 years’ experience in the industry. - AAMA offers an annual airport maintenance seminar for Alberta airport operators in late spring of each year in a central location that allows for open discussion of airport issues, regulations, and capital funding requirements in Alberta. The annual maintenance seminar was originated in 2001.
- Representing community airports, the AAMA has access to national community airport associations, which deal with federal legislation affecting regional and local airports. This advocacy role benefits all airports within Alberta and across Canada.
